51 Board President’s Report:

- 52 ➤ Mr. McDonald recognized Meredith Pobst, District Manager for Southeast Missouri Junior
53 Achievement for running the Junior Achievement program for 7th grade this year. Junior

54 Achievement helps students learn the principals of examining life choices, occupations,
55 budgets, decision-making and consequences. Mr. McDonald applauded Ms. Pobst and all
56 of the Junior Achievement volunteers for their hard work.

58 **Superintendent's Report:**

- 59 ➤ Dr. Welker announced that this week, November 15 – 21, is American Education Week.
60 Dr. Welker read the proclamation that Mayor Knudson signed before a group of Cape
61 Public School Students and noted that many activities are taking place at each of the
62 buildings in honor of the 88th annual American Education Week.
- 63 ➤ Dr. Welker reported that two informational meetings were held this past week to inform
64 staff of the district's financial status and the continued work toward a financial plan for
65 next year's budget.
- 66 ➤ Dr. Welker stated that as of tomorrow the district will have provided an opportunity for all
67 students to receive the H1N1 vaccination. Appreciation was given to the County Health
68 Department for providing this opportunity.
- 69 ➤ Dr. Welker informed the Board that the Community College Coalition met and agreed to a
70 partnership to provide community college services to the Cape Girardeau area. Southeast
71 Missouri State University, Three Rivers Community College, Mineral Area Community
72 College and Southeast Hospital School of Nursing will work together to provide these
73 services.
- 74 ➤ Dr. Welker mentioned that a CSIP video conference with David Lineberry took place today
75 and another meeting with Mr. Lineberry will be held December 1 as work on updating the
76 CSIP continues.
- 77 ➤ Dr. Welker announced that this Thursday there will be a Facilities Committee Meeting at
78 5:30.

- 81 ➤ Jena Mabry, CTA President, thanked Dr. Welker on behalf of the teachers for giving them
82 the opportunity to attend the two informational forums regarding the district's finances
83 and keeping them informed of what is happening.

- 88 ➤ Ms. Misty Clifton presented a Treasurer's report, which included the district's revenue and
89 expenses to date, transfers, and ending fund balance as of October 31, 2009 of
90 \$18,528,797.56 with an unrestricted fund balance of \$4,809,850.30.
- 91 ➤ Ms. Clifton's report also included District investments, balances and monthly expenditures
92 summary.

134 A motion was made by Mr. Smee and seconded by Dr. Trautwein to approve the Anthem Blue
 135 Cross/Blue Shield rates medical plan as presented to be effective January 1, 2010. Discussion
 136 followed and the motion carried with five yeas and one nay.

138 A motion was made by Mr. Smee and seconded by Mr. Nenninger to approve the school calendar
 139 for the 2011-2012 school year. Dr. Welker explained that this calendar was approved by the CTA
 140 Salary Committee's Calendar Sub- Committee and was voted on by the teachers. Discussion
